



## PRESENTATION AND POSTER GUIDELINES

## Oral Presentation:

1. The presenting author will be given 15 minutes for a PowerPoint oral presentation, followed by a question-and-answer session for 5 minutes.

## Poster Presentation:

- 1. Poster must be prepared in A1 size (594 x 841 mm) in portrait orientation.
- 2. The poster's contents (text, illustrations, etc.) should be legible from a distance of at least one meter.
- 3. The poster, which should be written in the English Language, must be able to stand alone and typically have the following contents:
  - Title (same as submitted abstract) to be placed at the top centre of the poster
  - Names of all authors with affiliations corresponding author to be indicated, contact (Email) to be provided
  - Content is essential, but keep it simple, clear & concise
  - The poster should include the following sections: Abstract, Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion, Conclusion and References
  - Introduction motivation, objectives, context
  - Methods and Materials theoretical models, experimental setup, and procedures (can be a flow chart)
  - Results highlight the significance of the findings supported by figures, tables, line
  - Use of graphics, colour, and different font types (maximum of two font types)
    can significantly enhance your poster
  - Fonts should be legible fonts like Times New Roman Arial, etc
  - Colour use with caution. Not too many colours (generally limited to 3)

4. The conference logo should be placed in the upper left-hand corner, whilst the authors' affiliated institution/university's logo and poster ID should be set in the upper right-hand corner of the poster.

5. Poster presenters must present their posters at the allocated time slots.
